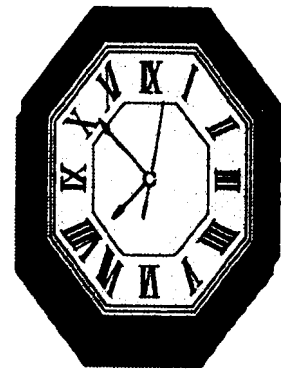
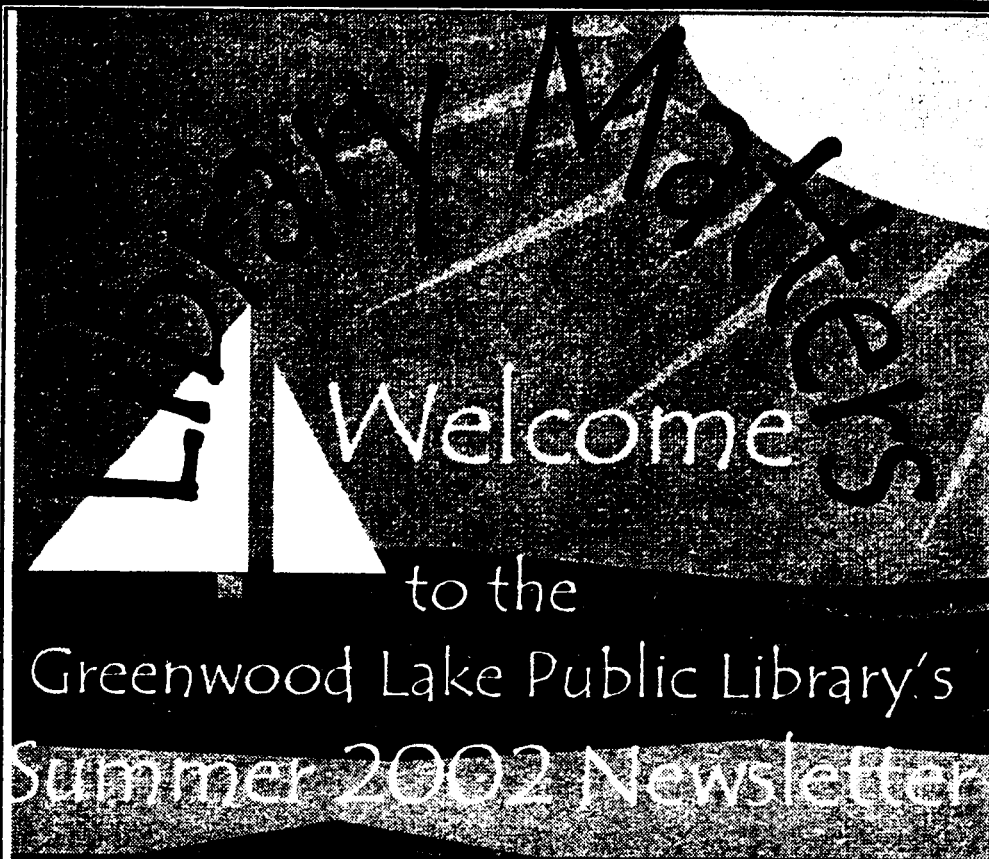

Dear Patrons,

On behalf of the Library Board of Trustees and staff of the Greenwood Lake Public Library, we would like to thank the Greenwood Lake School District voters for your overwhelmingly positive support for your library budget on May 16, 2002. The results were 53 to 15. You also elected Janice Dearing as an incoming trustee to fill the trustee position that becomes vacant as of July 1.

For those who prefer hard numbers, we present the following: the library added 4,525 items last year and now owns over 40,000 library materials; 80,727 items were circulated and an additional 19,232 items were used within the library; the library was open to the public over 3,100 hours; 3,809 patrons are registered borrowers and there were 94,692 visits made to our library last year, 8,599 adults and children attended 352 program sessions; the library staff answered 23,000 reference questions.

We have received \$3,535.00 in donations from private citizens, whom we recognize in our newsletter, which is published four times per year. Some of these citizens are anonymous and donate regularly in the donation jar at the circulation desk. We want to thank all that have been so generous in their support.

The Greenwood Lake Lions Club President Sam Yuppa just recently informed us that the Lion's Club is donating \$8,000.00 for shelving in the multi-media area. This area of the library is still in disarray. The Lion's Club supports local organizations in addition to its mission to support the hearing and visually impaired. By providing this desperately needed shelving for this area, the Lion's Club fulfills its mission. The multi-media area of the library will

be home to audio books, music CDs and tapes, videos and in the near future, DVDs. Although these materials are enjoyed by all, they best serve the segment of our population that have visual and auditory impairments.

We would like to thank Randy Zuk of Quality Sheds for the adorable table and chairs. This pintsize ensemble adds coziness to the children's area. In this same area, Ms. Laura Bullinger of Inka Binka Tailor & Cleaners designed and created the changeable window seat covers for our wooden window bench. We are grateful to these local business owners for their caring and generosity.

Additionally, special thanks go out to the wonderful staff at the library. During the two-week period we were closed, the staff was not on vacation. The library staff went above and beyond the call of duty. They came to work in jeans and tee-shirts everyday and physically moved shelving, books, videos, tables, chairs, and even items that were nailed down, creating the new, functional, and spacious areas we now have. Those on the staff who were unable to perform physical work manned the phones, arranged for special pick-ups of needed materials and ran various errands. The staff truly went out of their way to accommodate our patrons and prepare the building for re-opening on April 29th.

Finally, two of our trustees deserve special mention. Jill Cronin, who is completing her five-year term as library trustee has devoted many hours to the promotion and well being of this institution. Although Jill has not sought re-election for an

additional five-year term, she has volunteered to resurrect and rejuvenate the Friends of the Library group beginning in July. Participation in this group of library advocates is yet another way anyone in the community can get involved and support the library. Lisa Neyman, working on her first five-year term as trustee, headed up our Building Committee and has donated her time, expertise, and patience throughout this two-year project.

As for the future...we are in the midst of planning a Grand Opening celebration for the new addition on Sunday, September 8, 2002. Under the direction and supervision of Amy Ludmerer, our new Children's Librarian, we will continue to offer and run our extremely successful Summer Reading Program during July and August. Computer Storytime will run this summer and Adult Computer Classes will begin again in the fall under the tutelage of Joan Carvajal. In the fall, we have an incredible amount of varied, interesting, and fun adult, family and children's programs lined up. We will continue working to entice more and more of you into the library so that you too can take advantage of all the library has to offer.

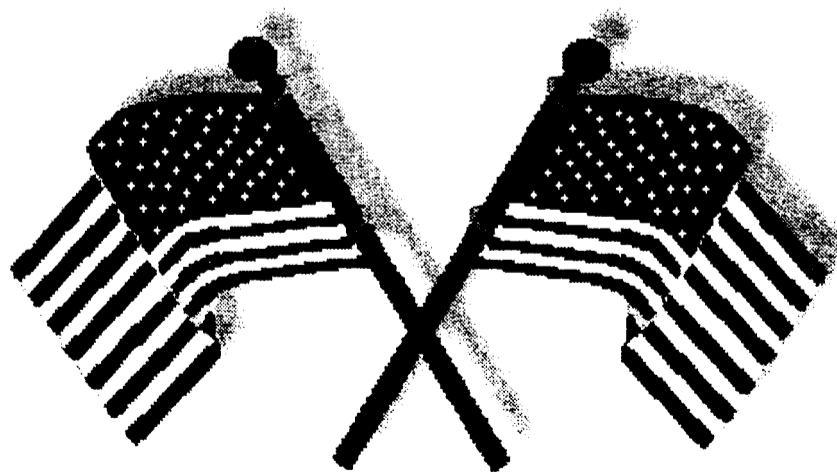

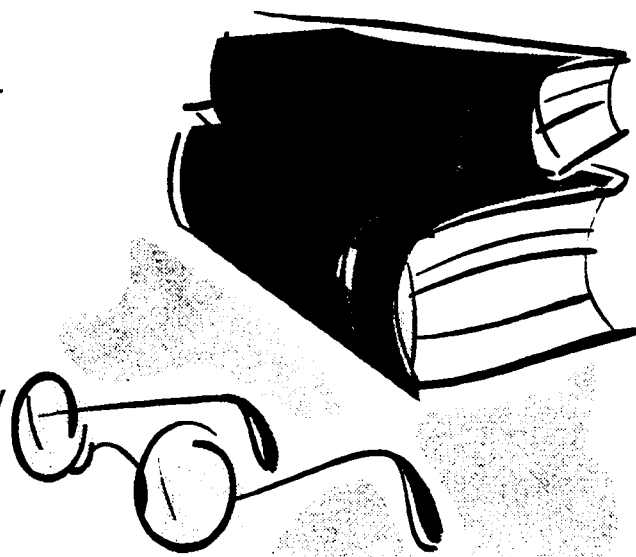
